ASTM TEST MONITORING BOARD MEETING June 18, 2007

Lowes Miami Beach Hotel Miami Beach, FL

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CALL TO ORDER

ASTM D02.B0.08, the Test Monitoring Board, met on Monday, June 18, 2007 at 5:20 p.m. in the Poinciana 2 room of the Lowes Miami Beach Hotel in Miami Beach, Florida. There were seven voting members (Keith Selby held the proxy of Matt Urbanak), six non-voting members, and three visitors present. The attendance roster is shown in Attachment A. Minutes from the December 4, 2006 meeting were approved.

MEMBERSHIP

The TMB voting membership was reviewed and is shown in Attachment B.

ADMINISTRATIVE GUIDANCE COMMITTEE

Chris Castanien reported that the Administrative Guidance Committee had not met during the past six months. Salary recommendations for TMC staff were communicated to Carnegie Mellon University.

TECHNICAL GUIDANCE COMMITTEE

Bill Buscher reported that the Technical Guidance Committee had not met since the last TMB meeting. He stated that the TGC will begin work on a project to develop a compilation of "best practices in lubricant test development."

DATA COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE

Frank Farber submitted the Data Communications Committee report (see Attachment C). The DCC did not meet during the past six months. The only current activity of the DCC is beta testing of report packet revisions.

TEST MONITORING CENTER

John Zalar summarized the TMC financial status. The TMC ended FY 2006 with revenue minus expense of \$+124,000 and reserves of \$2,691,000 equal to 17.6 months of operating expense. TMC financial performance for FY 2007 was expected to be significantly worse than FY 2006, with revenue minus

expense projected to be \$-180,000. Through the first four months of FY 2007, testing activity has been higher than expected with revenue minus expense at \$+40,000 better than one year ago. If this trend in testing continues, the actual financial performance for FY 2007 will be better than originally projected. The TMC annual independent financial audit was completed and distributed to the TMB voting members.

TMC staffing remains at 13 full-time employees.

The contract between ASTM and Carnegie Mellon University (CMU) was renewed on February 1, 2007. ASTM and CMU attorneys worked together on updated language in several sections of the contract dealing with liability issues. As the expiration date of the previous contract drew near, CMU and ASTM reached agreement on a new contract with a term one-year. The rates that determine the amount of overhead paid to CMU remained unchanged from the previous three contracts (13 years). Both sides indicated a desire to have a longer term contract on the next renewal.

Twenty information letters were issued by the TMC and were balloted within Subcommittee B. There were no negative votes. One comment received with an abstain vote on ISM Information Letter 07-2 did not require any action. The TMC report is shown in Attachment D.

OLD BUSINESS

There was no old business.

NEW BUSINESS

The TMB received a request from Section 3 for TMC services in support of the gear oil Storage Solubility and Compatibility tests. The specific services requested include reference oil storage and distribution and assistance in elevating the test procedures to ASTM standard test methods. This request received the unanimous support of the TMB.

NEXT MEETING

The next meeting is scheduled for December 3, 2007 in Phoenix, Arizona.

ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned at approximately 6:10 p.m.

Three of the letters, Sequence IIIF 07-1, Sequence IIIG 07-1, and ISM 07-2 required pre-balloting within Subcommittee B prior to issuance. The Sequence IIIF and IIIG letters dealt with the creation of the "viscosity only" versions of the tests, as requested by the HDEOCP. The ISM letter dealt with a controversial change to reference testing requirements. All three letters passed the Subcommittee B ballot (07-01) with no negatives. ISM 07-2 received one abstain with comment. The comment was acknowledged but did require any specific action.

The remaining seventeen letters are on the regular Spring Subcommittee B information letter ballot (07-03). The results of this ballot will be reported at the TMB meeting on June 18, 2007.

TMB ELECTIONS

Subcommittee B ballot 07-02 resulted in the elections of Matt Urbanak, Hannah Murray, Bill Lam, Greg Shank, and Norbert Nann to two-year terms starting January 1, 2007. There was one negative vote received. The chairman of the TMB Nominating Committee contacted the voter and the negative vote has been withdrawn.

NEW REFERENCE OILS

The following reference oils were received and processed by the TMC during the period from November 1, 2006 to April 30, 2007.

During this same time period, the TMC made 220 shipments of reference oils containing a total of 1,972 individual oil samples.

CALIBRATION TEST REPORTING

During the period from November 1, 2006 to April 30, 2007, 1671 calibration tests were reported to the TMC. Virtually 100% of all tests reported to the TMC are now transmitted electronically.
